
Welcome to Autumn 1!

Facts children need to know and learn:

- The world is made up of <u>7 continents</u>: North America, South America, Europe, Asia, Africa, Australia and Antarctica.
- The largest continent (in size) is Asia.
- The smallest continent (in size) is Australia.
- Millions of years ago, there used to be one continent called Pangaea. Over time, it split into 7 continents.
- Oceans separate the continents.
- The largest ocean is the Pacific Ocean.

- The Pacific Ocean contains half of the world's water.



map	A map is a drawing of all, or part, of Earth's surface.	earth	The third planet from the sun. We live on Earth.					
ocean	An ocean is a large area of salt water between continents.	weather	Weather is the way the air and atmosphere feels.
