

Welcome to Spring 1!

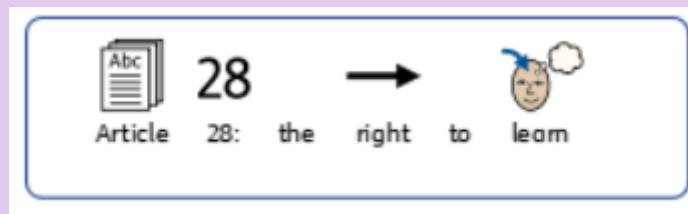
This term we will be focusing our home learning on the topic ‘Amazing Animals’. This will help consolidate the learning taking place in school.

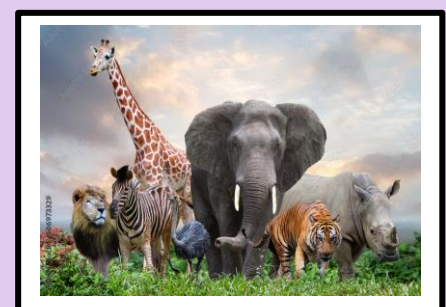

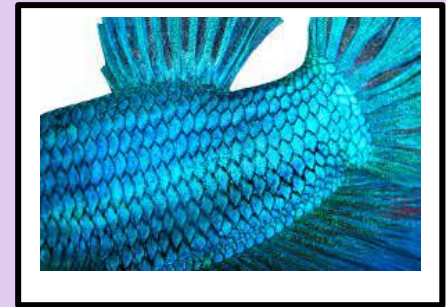

animal

A living thing that can move and needs food and water to survive.



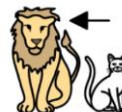
pet

An animal that people keep at home for enjoyment and company.



habitat

The natural place where an animal lives.



wild

Animals that live in their natural habitat and not looked after by humans.



sound

Anything that can be heard.



fur

Hair that covers some animals bodies to keep them warm.



feather

Covers birds to keep them warm and waterproof.



scales

Small plates on fish/reptiles that protects and keeps them waterproof.

To prepare for the Week 3 task:

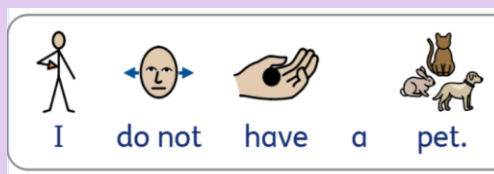
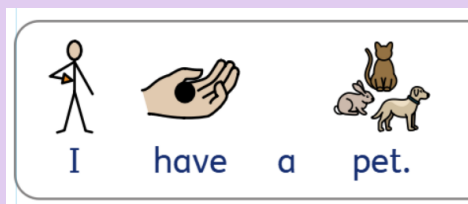
Start collecting items you could use for junk modelling.

Can you make an animal using materials you can find around your home? Some ideas below:



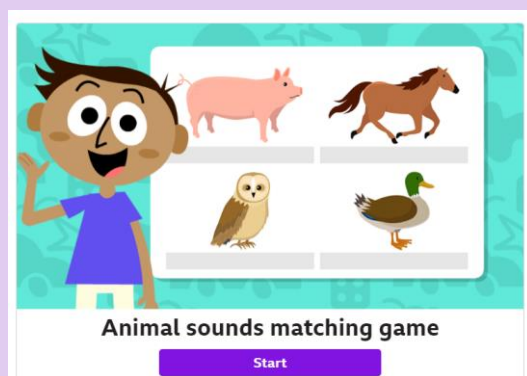

Week 5 - What do animals look like?

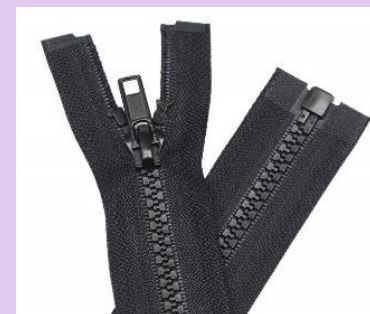
Bears have fur coats to keep them warm. How do you keep yourself warm?
