
# Welcome to Spring 2!

# Some key facts:

Key vocabulary and definitions			
minibeast	Small creatures that do not have a backbone including bees, spiders, ants, flies, butterflies.	habitat	The place where minibeasts live and they can find food, water and shelter.
wings	The part of a minibeast that allows them to fly.	antenna	A feeler found on the top of the head of some minibeasts.
legs	A part of a minibeasts body that supports movement.	slither	To move by sliding sideways in silence.
crawl	To move slowly with the body close to the ground.	fly	To move or pass through the air with wings.






Can you make a healthy snack that looks like a minibeast?
