


## Year 1 Welcome to Spring 2!



- The future is what could happen.




### Key pictures:

 <b>family tree</b>	A family tree is a visual representation of how different family members are related to each other.	 <b>living memory</b>	Living memory is something that you can remember because you were alive when it happened.
 <b>past</b>	The past is everything that has already happened.	 <b>chronological order</b>	Chronological order is when we put things, or events, in order from what happened first to what happened last.
 <b>present</b>	The present is how we describe the time that is happening right now, like the moment you are in or today!	 <b>timeline</b>	A timeline is a way to show and understand the order of events in a big line, from the past to the present.
