

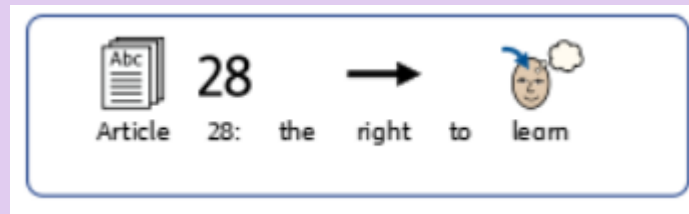
**Welcome to Summer 1!**

- The first successful aeroplane flight was completed in 1903 by the Wright Brothers.
- The Metropolitan line is the oldest underground railway line in the world and was opened in 1863. The youngest train TfL line is the Elizabeth line which opened in 2022.
- The Trans-Siberian Railway is the longest railway in the world.
- The Channel Tunnel connects England with France via an under the sea tunnel.
- People used to travel by horse drawn carriages.

A thing used to take people or goods from place to place, especially on land e.g. cars or vans.



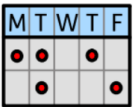
travel

*Can you explain why it is your favourite way to travel?*



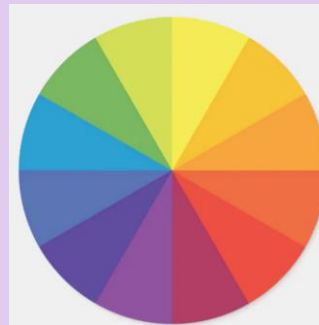
**Week 2- What do vehicles look like?**
