Focus - North of England

Facts children need to know and learn:

- Name East Anglian counties such as Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire and Essex.
- Understand that the landscape here is very flat.
- Compare the topography of The Yorkshire Dales and East Anglia.
- Ribblehead Viaduct and the Humber Bridge are two ways in which people have changed the landscape in Yorkshire and Humberside.
- There are four types of flood fluvial, pluvial, coastal and plumbing
- Understand how and why geographical regions have changed over time due to flooding.
- Discuss key features of an area, its land use and its links to economic activity.

Home Learning Tasks Week 1

Global Goal 14: Life below water

Week 2

Project: Use your research information from last week and create a travel brochure for that area.

Week 3

Reflection – Draw a human life cycle diagram with explanations.

Project: Research about an area in East Anglia that experienced a natural disaster e.g. flooding

Research questions:

What happened? Where did it happen? When did it happen?

Resources – Using paper or OneNote, gather your information about the natural disaster that happened in one of the counties in East Anglia.

Another way of presenting this could be to draw a picture of the disaster and you could add a sentence about what happened.

Week 4

Global Goals 13: Climate change action

Reflection – The meat production industry has a huge impact on the environment. Cook and eat a vegetarian meal for at least one day this week.

Project: Use the information from last week to present the news about the natural disaster in the county.

Resources – record your news using an iPad or phone



Another way of presenting this could be to draw an image to present the natural disaster in the county.

Week 5

RRS Article 38: (war and armed conflicts)

Governments must not allow children under the age of 15 to take part in war or join the armed forces. Governments must do everything they can to protect and care for children affected by war and armed conflicts.

Reflection – Many children are affected by war and conflict in the world today. Reflect upon what you can do help them or say a prayer to show love and care.

Project: Come up with some interview questions that you could ask someone that lives on/near a flood plain.

Resources – Using paper or OneNote.



Another way of presenting this could be to record yourself asking the questions.

Week 6

Global Goal 8: Decent work and economic growth.

Reflection – Reflect on what job you would like to have in the future.

Project: Create a model, presentation or diagram of the water cycle.



Resources – PowerPoint
